Re: Clarity on the recognition of qualifications to teach Catholic Religious Education on the island of Ireland.

Dear colleagues,

There has been a significant number of queries with respect to the question of whether not teachers qualified prior to September 2011 are required to hold a qualification recognised in the 'Recognition of Qualifications to Teach Catholic Religious Education in Catholic Primary Schools on the Island of Ireland' (2018) document issued by the Council for Catechetics of the Irish Episcopal Conference.

The 2018 document states:

The requirements set out below were first made effective from September 2011 forward, without prejudice to those who qualified as primary teachers prior to this date in any of the approved centres listed in Section C of this document.

Queries in the main were with respect to teachers who qualified in the UK prior to 2011, but other queries related to the selection and appointment of teachers to the post of Principal or Deputy Principal.

For clarity, the following applies:

1. <u>Teachers who qualified prior to 2011:</u> The rules regarding the recognised certificate do not apply. These applicants should be called for interview where otherwise deemed eligible. This applies to Irish or UK qualified teachers.

However, the advertisement should clearly indicate that for teachers who qualified prior to September 2011, a recognised qualification to teach Catholic Religious Education on the island of Ireland is desirable.

2. For <u>all other applicants who apply for teaching vacancies</u>: <u>Only</u> those teachers who hold a <u>recognised</u> certificate to teach RE should be called for interview.

NOTE: UK qualified teachers\* who have undertaken a *Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies (CCRS)* in England or Wales, must also have completed a supplementary qualification to meet the requirements to teach in Catholic Primary schools on the island of Ireland. At present, the Mater Dei Centre for Catholic Education in DCU is the only third level provider of this qualification.

\*Other than those holding a *Catholic Teacher's Certificate in Religious Education* qualification from the St Andrew's Foundation for Catholic Teacher Education, University of Glasgow.

**3.** For <u>Principal/Deputy Principal competitions:</u> The rules regarding the recognised qualifications do not apply with respect to applicants who qualified prior to September 2011. These applicants may be called for interview where otherwise deemed eligible. However, the advertisement should clearly indicate that for teachers who qualified prior to September 2011, a recognised qualification to teach Catholic Religious Education on the island of Ireland is desirable.

For **teachers who qualified after September 2011**, <u>only</u> those applications who hold a **recognised** certificate to teach RE should be called for interview.
